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

CHECKING IN

For a howling good time with the family, Great Wolf Lodge in LaGrange, Georgia delivers! The fun actually starts at check-in. Seriously. Other lobby activities include Yoga Tails, the Hustle & Howl dance party and the popular storytime, where kids gather in their pajamas to hear bedtime stories. Your wolf pack will all get wristbands, which will act as a convenient room key and a contactless way to pay for items around the resort.

LODGE From check-in to check-out, here's your complete guide to Georgia's

> The rooms have a lodge feel to them and were designed with families in mind. Most have two queen beds and a pullout sofa to accommodate your crew. If you want to take your stay to the next level, try one of the unique theme rooms. The Wolf Den suites have a cave theme and the KidCabin suites have a log cabin look with either twin beds or bunk beds. Some rooms can sleep up to 13!

WATER ADVENTURES

Of course, the main attraction is the 93,000 square-foot waterpark where the water is always a pleasant 84 degrees. On the day you check-in, you can use the water park starting at 1 p.m. And here's a tip: On the day you check out, you can stay and play all day. There are four-story tube rides and a water jet-fueled vortex for thrill-seeking teens and more tame slides for the littles, in addition to splash pads, a lazy river and a wave pool. If you want a special retreat, check out the cabana rentals, which are stocked with plenty of refreshing beverages, towels, a sofa, fridge, fan, TV, and other amenities.

DRY LAND ACTIVITIES

Great Wolf Lodge is more than a water park and the fun doesn't stop once you dry off. Try MagiQuest, the live-action game. Choose a magic wand and see how it opens up a treasure hunt within the resort. The fun is in finding the special, interactive stations located all over – even in some of the rooms. Kids can take their magic wand home with them as a souvenir.

DINING

You can bring your own food into the park and the rooms have refrigerators. When you're ready for a treat, there are so many different restaurants available: from sit-down style to craveable, quickserve food trucks open for breakfast, lunch, dinner, snacks and desserts.

If parents want a little "me" time, there's Camp H.O.W.L. with activities to keep the kids entertained while you adult. (It should be renamed Camp Win-Win because it's hard to tell who's getting the better part of the deal.) Make it a date night at Barnwood restaurant with locally sourced food and craft cocktails; then wind down at the fire pit outside. course. Or maybe you'd like to challenge your family to a friendly game of mini-golf or bowling. Ten Paw Alley has shorter lanes and kid-size bowling balls available that are easier for little hands. The adventure park also features Oliver's Mining Company, where you can try your luck at panning for gold. Gamers will also love the huge Northern Lights arcade that's open 24 hours and caters to all ages. \blacklozenge

Lakeside Trails are well used by bikers, hikers and nature lovers throughout Georgia. The trails cover eleven miles of beautiful terrain alongside West Point Lake, giving visitors stunning views of West Point Dam and the lake itself.

LIBERTY HILL SPORTING CLUB

Liberty Hill Sporting Club boasts 700 acres of beautiful Georgia scenery and offers

sport clay shooting. Guided hunts at this expansive reserve can be arranged and guns are available at no extra charge. For overnight hunting trips, book the club's on-site cabin (it holds up to eight people)!

SWEETLAND AMPHITHEATRE

A more relaxed outdoor experience can be found at Sweetland Ampitheatre. Home to some of the best concerts to ever rock Georgia, Sweetland has hosted performances from some all-time greats like Willie Nelson, Gladys Knight, The Temptations, Vince Gill, and Boyz II Men.

THE THREAD TRAIL

Tailor-made for walking, running and cycling, The Thread is LaGrange's signature trail system. Winding through historic neighborhoods, a college campus and connecting many of the city's businesses and parks, The Thread is the perfect way to explore LaGrange while taking in some fresh air.

GRANGER PARK

A cornerstone of The Thread Trail system, Granger Park is a multi-use outdoor facility for visitors of all ages. A brand new playground greets the youngest guests with exciting slides and state-of-the-art equipment. A full size track and field is also available (when the local High School isn't practicing) for recreation and exercise. Multiple basketball courts and The McCluskey Tennis Center give you an opportunity for a little competition during your trip to LaGrange.

FISHINGGUIDE

In the state that produced the world record largemouth bass, it's no surprise that Troup County's West Point Lake is a popular fishing destination. People from all over the country have visited for an attempt at one of our trophy fish!

The Great Outdoors

The 26,000-acre reservoir of West Point Lake offers a variety of fishing options, whether you fish from a boat or the dock. The most sought-after fish in West Point Lake are largemouth bass and crappie, but you can also find catfish, stripers and hybrids. Some of our local guides have spent decades learning the secrets of this lake and have caught trophy fish in their home waters.

Local anglers love spring, fall and very early winter on the lake, when the weather is perfect and the fish are biting. While you're fishing, be sure to observe the plentiful wildlife. West Point Lake is home to bald eagles and osprey who nest around the lake. Spring offers chances to see the eagles nesting and hatching their young, and fortunate anglers may catch the sight of osprey diving for their dinner. In winter months, watch for the lake loons who fly south to spend winter in the warmth of the Georgia sun. The lake shore is home to deer, turkey, and foxes that can be spotted by careful observers. There are dozens of West Point Lake parks to fish from the lake shore. Both McGee Bridge Park and Rocky Point Recreation Area have concrete piers for the public. Rocky Point Recreation Area has a fishing pier, boat ramp, restrooms, bath house, picnic area and shelter, playground and hiking trails. Many locals and visitors bring lanterns to night fish from these covered docks! If you own a boat (or rent one from Highland Pines Marina), try fishing under the Yellow Jacket Bridge or the 109 Bridge. These bridges are great for tying up and fishing overnight. The Yellow Jacket Boat Ramp is a popular putin and there's plenty of good fishing in that area. To fish mid-lake and the whole lower end, use the boat ramp at Horace King Park, which has a picnic area and restroom. To fish above mid-lake, put in at Highland Marina.

Once you've planned your fishing trip, visit Hudson's Pro Shop in LaGrange for all your gear and a Georgia fishing license. Come see why Georgia fishing draws anglers from every corner of the country!

With a generous visual arts community and revolving exhibitions, LaGrange has not one, but three art galleries waiting with their doors open to entertain and educate the community.

THE COCHRAN GALLERY

In 2007, Wes and Missy Cochran opened the doors to the Cochran Gallery (top) in downtown LaGrange. Although the gallery has been open for 13 years, Wes and Missy have been adding to their impressive collection since the 1970s. The Cochrans boast a collection of some of the most captivating American art made in the 20th century, including pieces from Warhol, Rosenquist, Gilliam, Woodruff, and many others.


LAGRANGE ART MUSEUM

Housed in a Victorian jail building from 1892, which also once served as a furniture store and the LaGrange Daily News offices, the LaGrange Art Museum (center) opened its doors in 1963 by a group of local artists. The building itself is a large part of the artistic heritage of the museum. The permanent collection of the museum launched when local hero Lamar Dodd, a celebrated visual artist, donated a painting to the museum. Filled with interesting exhibitions by both distinguished and local artists, the gallery has a highquality collection, all available to view with free admission (although donations are highly encouraged).

LAMAR DODD ART CENTER

The Lamar Dodd Art Center (bottom) is on LaGrange College's campus and hosts a constantly revolving collection along with the college's art department. The museum's namesake is well-known artist Lamar Dodd, who took his first formal art class at the college. Funded by a grant from Callaway Foundation, Inc., the three-story building holds a retrospective collection of Dodd's artwork, the Josephine Altman Case Collection of Plains and Southwest American Indian Art, a Masters of Twentieth-Century Photography along with singular works by Rembrandt, Dali, Picasso and others. ◆

Maggie McDonald, owner of Pure Life House of Music, blessed LaGrange with this gem in 2015 and it's been a staple ever since. With the help of her family and house manager Jane Mauldin, Maggie created an atmosphere of musicianship, originality, and creative expression so powerful you're sure to remember your Pure Life experience for a lifetime. Housed in a renovated warehouse and just a five minute drive from downtown, Pure Life House of Music is nestled in the historic Hillside neighborhood. The venue is also brown bag approved, making it perfect for a date night or friends outing.

The first weekend in March each year in LaGrange, Georgia, the Azalea Storytelling Festival keeps the art of storytelling alive and vibrant. This highquality, family-friendly event draws approximately 2,500 visitors each year with patrons attending from 23 states and several foreign countries.

LaGrange has a beautiful history that remains ever-present in many of the restaurants, event spaces and other attractions around town today.

CALLAWAY MONUMENT

Callaway Memorial Tower, also known as Callaway Monument was built in 1929 as a tribute to textile magnate Fuller E. Callaway, Sr. Construction was sponsored by mill employees, who each donated one day's pay in an effort to honor the legacy of Fuller Callaway.

LAGRANGE ART MUSEUM

Since its construction in 1892, the building that presently houses the LaGrange Art Museum has been many things, beginning as the Troup County Jail before serving as a furniture store, the LaGrange Daily News offices and now an art gallery. Its Victorianstyle architecture is reflective of the late 1800s—and part of what makes the structure so iconic in our modern downtown.

TASTE OF LEMON

An excellent spot for delicious Southern cuisine, Taste of Lemon is in another building built in 1892: the former Second Methodist Church. The outside of the restaurant is virtually unchanged from the original structure's design, and the inside maintains the charm of the old sanctuary while providing a wonderful ambiance for good eatin'.

LEGACY MUSEUM ON MAIN

The building now occupied by Legacy Museum On Main has a storied history. Erected in 1917, its doors first opened on January 1st, 1918 as the LaGrange National Bank. Since then, the edifice has been home to several different businesses. including C&S (Citizens and Southern) Bank, Goodwill and the Troup County Historical Society—the latter of which installed the Legacy Museum in 2007.

LAGRANGE COLLEGE

Founded in 1831 as LaGranae Female Academy, LaGrange College has been a cornerstone of our city for almost 200 years and is the oldest private college in Georgia. Often ranked as one of the best values amona Southern colleges, LaGrange College also boasts one of the most beautiful campuses outside the Ivy League. A stunning chapel, historic Smith Hall and Callaway Auditorium (home of the LaGrange Symphony Orchestra) make LaGrange College a gorgeous and historic place to visit. ♦

Neel Reid is responsible for some of the South's most iconic properties. He had his hands on most of Ansley Park in Atlanta, Mimosa Hall in Roswell (which became his home), and a version of George Washington's Mount Vernon across from the governor's mansion. Reid became a friend to the Callaways and took his time to ensure the design of their iconic home really complemented the beautiful Ferrell Gardens.

GET A TASTE OF CALLAWAY LIFE

Without a doubt, the Callaway family changed the face of the entire state of Georgia by not only developing industry but also supporting cultural, humanitarian and religious causes. Step inside their home and you get a better sense of their love of family and community, and their strong faith.

HI MICKLEBERRY! He's a feral rescue cat who lives on the property and enjoys meandering through the garden paths with guests. Of course, he must have learned his technique from the human guides who are all incredibly warm, welcoming and eager to share their knowledge.

STUNNING FLORAL ARRANGEMENTS

They're all created by resident designer David Brown, using cuttings from the garden. Alice Callaway loved all kinds of flowers, especially white orchids, calla lilies and tropicals. You can view her collection that is still being propagated in the greenhouse today.

That's how the Atlanta Journal described their visit 50 years ago and it's still incredibly accurate. More than dignified, manicured boxwoods, it's a spiritual retreat. the legacy of HORACE KING

HIGHLY RESPECTED ENGINEER




Horace King was born in 1807 in South Carolina. Unlike most enslaved persons, he was taught to read and write at a young age. By adulthood, he'd become a competent builder. The Town Lattice truss design he used for building bridges was patented by Ithiel Town.

Around 1830, King was purchased by contractor John Godwin. Godwin took King with him to build a bridge over the Chattahoochee River and the pair began working on construction projects throughout the South.

In the mid-1830s, Godwin sent King to Oberlin College in Ohio, the first college to admit African Americans. Following his education, King returned to work with Godwin, building courthouses and bridges throughout Georgia and Alabama. In 1841, they rebuilt their Columbus City Bridge which had been destroyed in a flood.

Godwin experienced financial difficulty in the late 1830s and transferred ownership of King to his wife and her uncle, possibly to protect King from being taken by creditors. King was permitted to marry a free woman, Frances Gould Thomas, which was a rare allowance within states practicing the enslavement of people.

By the 1840s, King and Godwin were considered "co-builders," another rarity for an African American man. Around this time, King's skill and reputation surpassed Godwin's and he began working independently, supervising major bridge construction. King befriended Robert Jemison, Jr., an attorney and entrepreneur in Alabama, who

used King to build several of his projects.Unlike most enslaved persons, King was permitted to keep some earnings from his work, which he eventually used to buy his freedom in 1846. Under Alabama law, he was only allowed to remain in the state for one year after purchasing freedom. His friend Jemison used his seat in the Alabama State Senate to arrange legislation allowing King to remain in Alabama as a free man. In 1852, King purchased land near John Godwin. When Godwin died in 1859, King had a monument built to mark his grave.

King later partnered with other men to construct Moore's Bridge over the Chattahoochee (near Whitesburg, GA) and gained interest in the bridge. He moved his family near the bridge in 1858 and they collected bridge tolls and farmed their land as King continued building bridges throughout the Southeast.

When the Civil War began, King was conscripted by the Confederate army to build obstructions and defenses in the Apalachicola River and Alabama River. In 1863, he was moved back to Columbus to build a mill that manufactured cladding for Confederate warships.

Many of his bridges were destroyed during the Civil War, including Moore's Bridge, which King owned, and the Columbus City Bridge. Postwar rebuilding efforts created plenty of work for King, who rebuilt the Columbus City Bridge for the third time in his life. He

built factories, buildings and several bridges over the Chattahoochee.

In 1867, King became a registrar for voters in Russell County, Alabama. In 1868 he was elected to the Alabama House of Representatives and was reelected in 1870. He did not seek reelection for a third term. Instead, King moved his family to LaGrange, Georgia. He trained his children in construction as he continued building. By the mid-1870s, he was passing projects onto his children, who formed King Brothers Bridge Company.

King's health began to fail in the 1880s and he died on May 28, 1885. His death was reported in all major Georgia newspapers, a rarity for an African American. He was posthumously inducted into the Alabama Engineers Hall of Fame at the University of Alabama.

To see Horace King's work, you need only to visit LaGrange's LaFayette downtown square. He built nearly the entire east side of the square and parts of the north side. When King died, his funeral processed around the square and business came to a stop as residents, both black and white, came out to pay their respects. King is buried in Mulberry Street Cemetery in LaGrange. •

From the site of one of the last Civil War battles to stately antebellum homes and historical gardens, LaGrange is full of history. This three-day itinerary will have you yearning for more to learn about the fascinating history of the area.



DAY 1



Ancient Middle East & Callaway Family Home

A must-visit while in LaGrange, Hills & Dales Estate was completed in 1916 and features a 13,000 square-foot home which was designed to flow gracefully into its gardens—a series of dwarf boxwood parterres planted by Sarah Ferrell, which have adorned the terraces of the hill for more than 175 years. After your tour, be sure to pay a visit to the Biblical History Center, which allows your family to encounter the ancient world through history and culture. Once you've worked up an appetite,

sit down to some good old fashioned Southern cooking at Taste of Lemon (in the former Second Methodist Church building, constructed in 1892). Taste of Lemon serves lunch in a meat-and-three style during the week. Looking for a weekend option? 505 Eats is the perfect spot to sit down and enjoy some of the best lunchtime cooking there is!





Explore Historic Downtown LaGrange

Perfect for exploration, LaGrange College boasts nearly 200 years of history, beautiful landscaping and a stunning vantage point from its location on "The Hill." LaGrange College was chartered in 1831 and was the first private college in Georgia. To visit campus, park in the lot at the corner of Broad Street and Park Avenue. After your tour, take a walk downtown and make a pit stop at Charlie Joseph's for the most delicious hot dog ever!



Civil War Fort & Craft Beer Homage to Textile History

Fort Tyler (in nearby West Point) was the last Confederate fort captured by the Union,

giving it the distinction, "Last Fort to Fall." Today, a marked trail leads visitors to the site of this small earthen fort overlooking the Chattahoochee River. After visiting the fort, check out the Elm City Plant, which showcases the attractive architectural features of textile mills during the early 1900s. All mills had towers and Elm




Local Sounds, Hidden Gems & Music Legends

Begin your epic stay with epic sound. In the Hillside neighborhood of LaGrange, Georgia, Pure Life House of Music is tailor-made for a variety of solo, duo and trio acts playing blues, jazz, folk and assorted acoustic genres. Pure Life is the only live music venue in LaGrange that offers an intimate listening experience. Eclectic seating adds charm to this 130-seat listening room, which focuses on the singer/ songwriter and the performance. Stop by

Wild Leap Brew Co. to pick up a couple of brews before you make your way over and you may encounter another chance to hear local music thanks to Wild Leap's outdoor performance space.

If you're wanting something with a little more oomph, Sweetland Amphitheatre might be more your speed. The 2,500 seat venue provides an outdoor venue for star-studded performances and community events, all within walking distance of downtown restaurants and shops and near local hotels and attractions. Up-and-coming performers like Jimmie Allen and Jason Isbell have performed at Sweetland, which is carefully carved into the existing hillside, creating a tiered bowl. With stadium, table and lawn seating, Sweetland has plenty of seating options for spectators!

The LSPA is an instrumental organization in promoting cultural awareness, artistic expression and appreciation for the performing arts. The LSPA provides resources and support for the artistic communities under its umbrella and seeks to create various opportunities for enjoying the performing arts. Less than a mile from the downtown square that shares its name, the LSPA is the home of The Lafayette Ballet Company, Young Singers of West Georgia, The Lafayette Theatre Company and The Lafayette Dance Academy. The Lafayette Ballet Guild, The Lafayette Theatre Academy, The Azalea Storytelling Festival and The Lafayette Outreach Program also call LSPA home—which means you are guaranteed to experience something exciting and memorable during your visit.

Beautiful churches, such as First Baptist Church on the Square and First United Methodist Church serve as spiritual and inspirational hubs for our city, and many can be seen along our signature walking trail, The Thread!



A 19th Century Garden and an Exploration of Iconic Southern Architecture

Your second day starts with a tour of Hills & Dales Estate. This beloved and historic site features a 13,000 square-foot home, designed to flow gracefully into the gardens which have adorned the property for over 175 years. The Church Garden, a stunning all-white garden that peaks in late spring, is a particularly magnificent example of the beauty of Hills & Dales Estate. Chris-

tian iconography and the natural peacefulness of the Church Garden create a wonderful space for a mid-day prayer or meditation.

If you find yourself inspired to explore more, consider visiting historic Bellevue. Built between 1852 and 1855, Bellevue is a significant example of the "domesticated temple" form of Greek Revival-style architecture popular in the antebellum South. Bellevue became the home of the LaGrange Woman's Club in 1942 when the Fuller E. Callaway Foundation presented the home to the club. Bellevue is a National Historic Landmark. Itineraries
